ADDITIONAL MANDATORY FEES

APPLICATION FEE (NEW STUDENTS):

- \$75 non-refundable application fee.
- This fee must be paid online when submitting initial application.

REGISTRATION/ENROLLMENT FEE (NEW STUDENTS):

If offered admission to Berean, a non-refundable registration fee must be submitted to the school to confirm your enrollment:

- \$440 for seniors (includes a \$50 fee toward graduation expenses).
- \$390 for all others.
- Your admissions letter will contain details about the registration fee payment options and deadline.

REGISTRATION/RE-ENROLLMENT FEE (RETURNING STUDENTS):

On or before 3/02/12

- \$440 for seniors (includes a \$50 fee toward graduation expenses).
- \$390 for all others.

After 3/02/12 - a \$100 late fee applies:

- \$540 for seniors.
- \$490 for all others.

Registration fee will be collected as part of the online re-enrollment process via electronic check, credit card, or debit card.

ISP/PART-TIME APPLICATION AND REGISTRATION/RE-ENROLLMENT FEES:

- ISP students will be subject to same application fees, registration fees and deadlines as described above for new and returning students.
- ISP students will be billed additional tuition and fees as follows:

ISP enrollment – one or more classes taken on campus:

- Tuition for each class taken on campus is 1/5 of total full-time tuition (\$1,720) for each on-campus class. A 10-month payment option of \$172 per class per month is available.
- A \$25 per semester ISP administration fee will be assessed in August (due Sept. 1st) and January (due Feb. 1st).
- ISP students who attend All-School Retreat will be subject to an additional fee, pro-rated by number of on-campus classes enrolled in:
one class: \$200; two classes: \$150; three classes: \$100; four classes: \$50.
- Other class and activity fees may apply depending upon course and activity selections as per pages 2-3.
- Test proctoring by Berean staff of non-Berean classes will be assessed a fee of \$25 per exam.

ISP enrollment – NO classes on campus:

- A \$125 ISP administration fee will be billed in August, due September 1st. (Seniors who will not be participating in graduation ceremonies will be billed only \$90).
- Students who attend All-School Retreat will be billed \$250.
- Test proctoring by Berean staff of non-Berean classes will be assessed a fee of \$25 per exam.

TECHNOLOGY FEE:

- All students enrolled in on-campus classes (including ISP) will be assessed a mandatory technology fee of \$100 per semester to support integration of technology and curriculum (including iPad roll-out).
- 1st semester fee will be billed in August, due September 1st
- 2nd semester fee will be billed in January, due February 1st

ADDITIONAL EXPENSES

IN ADDITION TO THE TUITION AND MANDATORY FEES DESCRIBED ABOVE, MOST STUDENTS WILL INCUR ADDITIONAL FEES DEPENDING UPON THEIR CLASS, ACTIVITY, AND TRANSPORTATION SELECTIONS. THE MOST COMMON FEES ARE DESCRIBED BELOW. UPON EVALUATION, NEW OFFERINGS NOT LISTED BELOW MAY ALSO BE ASSESSED FEES.

P.E. CLOTHING AND LOCKS

These items must be purchased by all incoming students and may be used throughout the student's tenure at Berean.

- P.E. Clothes - \$20 for Berean PE shorts and shirt (optional sweat clothes available at additional cost).
- Locks - \$15

LAB FEES

\$10 assessed first semester only to students taking:

- Physics
- AP Physics
- Astronomy

\$15 per semester:

- Art & Sculpture Classes

\$20 assessed first semester only:

- Biology
- Chemistry

\$25 per semester:

- Introduction to Computer Technology

\$30 assessed first semester only:

- Mechanical Drawing
- Architectural Design

\$30 per semester:

- Advanced Graphic Arts
- Computer Programming/Web Design

\$35 per semester:

- Anatomy/Physiology
- Honors Anatomy/Physiology
- On Your Own

\$90 assessed second semester only:

- per each AP class

OTHER FEES

TBD—exact amounts will vary from year to year. Parents should plan to attend informational meetings to be informed of full financial commitments required for various activities. Amounts shown are typical range for recent years.

- Advanced Drama tour: \$300-\$350
- Abundant Life Singers tour : \$300-\$350
- Chorale/Girls' Choir tour : \$300-\$350
- Performance clothing for ALS and Chorale/Girls' Choir: \$50-\$150
- Cheerleading : \$1,500-\$3,000 per year for uniforms and accessories, off-site gymnastics training, competition fees, camps, etc.
- Field trips: \$10-\$25

ATHLETIC FEES

Charged to students participating in interscholastic sports in a given school year:

- 1st sport @ \$300
- 2nd sport @ \$150
- 3rd sport @ \$100

Notes:

- 1) Fees can be reimbursed within 2 weeks from the start of the season for students choosing to withdraw from the team. Students joining the team late will be required to pay the full sport fee if they desire to receive credit for playing.
- 2) Upon approval of the athletic director, a portion of school fees may be refunded at the rate of \$10 per game for selected parental volunteer efforts in the basketball or football programs.
- 3) Although uniforms are provided for most sports, some teams may require extra items to be purchased (e.g. footwear, warm-ups, swimsuits, other gear). Parents should plan to attend team informational meetings to find out the full financial commitment of a participating in any particular sport.
- 4) The Berean Booster Club provides scholarships toward the athletic fees for student athletes with financial need in exchange for a service commitment.

OPTIONAL EXPENSES**TRANSPORTATION EXPENSES**

Berean offers bus transportation to and from school from selected locations in Antioch, Pittsburg, Clayton, Concord, Martinez, and Walnut Creek. Students are billed per one-way trip, and fee per ride depends upon bus stop location used (e.g., varying from \$2.00 from Walnut Creek to \$3.50 from Antioch in recent years). Fees are subject to change in the event of significant fuel price changes.

TEST PROCTORING FEES

Students who use Berean staff for test proctoring of non-Berean class exams will be assessed a fee of \$25 per exam.

OTHER OPTIONAL EXPENSES

Athletic events, drama and music productions, banquets and socials, yearbooks, and school photos.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**CHRISTIAN MINISTRY SCHOLARSHIP**

Granted upon application to families with a parent employed for pay in designated full-time Christian ministries with family income not exceeding qualifying income levels.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Granted upon application to financially qualifying families needing assistance. Main evaluation criteria include family income, family size, and number of students currently enrolled at Berean.

VALEDICTORIAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Offered to 8th grade valedictorians from Christian schools in the area who attend Berean full-time as freshmen. Scholarship is \$25 per month (for 10 months) for the freshman year. (Ask the junior high school office to send a letter to Berean acknowledging the student's valedictorian qualification).

GENERAL

The financial assistance programs above are available to full-time students only, and only apply to the tuition portion of a family's obligation. Funds are limited; apply by May 04, 2012 for first-round consideration. Awards are granted for one school year. Families with continuing need will need to re-apply each year.

FINANCIAL POLICIES**GENERAL**

- **All** payments are due on the **first** of each month.
- We offer a generous 10-day grace period for monthly payments, but payments received after the 10th of the month will have a \$25 late fee automatically added to the respective account.
- Account payments are made directly to Berean Christian High School. Monthly billing statements will be mailed or emailed to accounts with a current balance due.
- Payment by electronic fund transfer (EFT) will be available for 2012-2013, and EFT enrollment is highly encouraged to ensure timely payment. Personal checks, billpay checks, cash, cashier's checks, and money orders are also accepted.
- Recurring payment on account balances by credit card is not available at this time. An occasional credit card payment can be accepted, but transaction limits apply and a convenience fee will be assessed. Contact our Accounting Manager for details about limits and fees.
- Returned checks and failed EFT transactions will result in a \$25 fee charged to your account, and \$25 late fee will also be assessed if your failed payment results in late payment. Your check will not be reprocessed; you must submit a new payment.
- Students with accounts more than two months delinquent at semester break will not be allowed to return the following semester.
- Report cards and diplomas of students with outstanding balances at year end will be withheld until the balance is paid in full. Returning students may not begin the next school year and may forfeit their enrollment if prior year's balance is not paid off before the next school year begins.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

- Should a student withdraw without completing the school year, additional tuition may be due even if monthly tuition payments are current. A detailed explanation of how pro-rated tuition is calculated will be provided at the time of withdrawal, but note that 1st semester tuition is weighted at 5/9 of total annual tuition due to the overhead costs of starting a student. (When tuition has been prepaid in part or in full, a partial tuition refund may be issued upon withdrawal).
- All application, registration, class, and activity fees are non-refundable once billed, unless billed in error.
